ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 14th day of September 1970

PURSUANT to section 1 of the Post Office Amendment Act 1968, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Post Office Amendment Act Commencement Order 1970.

2. Commencement—Sections 2 and 3 of the Post Office Amendment Act 1968 shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of notification of this order in the *Gazette*.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order brings into force sections 2 and 3 of the Post Office Amendment Act 1968 which relate to licensing of broadcasting stations and unlawful broadcasting stations within the territorial limits of New Zealand and on the high seas.
