**THE POST OFFICE EMPLOYEES' SICK BENEFIT FUND
REGULATIONS 1969, AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 16th day of August 1982

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office Employees' Sick Benefit Fund Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office Employees' Sick Benefit Fund Regulations 1969* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Temporary and non-classified employees may become contributors—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 15, and substituting the following regulation:

“15. (1) Any person employed full-time as a non-classified employee may, by written application to the trustees, apply to become a contributor to the fund.

- “(2) Any person who is employed—
“(a) Full-time as a temporary employee; or
“(b) Part-time as a temporary employee; or
“(c) Part-time as a non-classified employee,—

and who has completed 5 years service with the Post Office may, by written application to the trustees, apply to become a contributor to the fund.

“(3) Any person who becomes a contributor to the fund under this regulation shall do so on such terms and conditions as the trustees may determine, and any such person who has been accepted by the trustees as a contributor shall be deemed to be an employee to whom section 182 of the Post Office Act 1959 applies.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Post Office Employees' Sick Benefit Fund Regulations 1969 to provide that full-time non-classified employees no longer need to have 5 years' service with the Post Office before applying to join the fund.
