PRICE ORDER NO. 1.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Price Tribunal by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939, and with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1.
- 2. The maximum price at which new sacks measuring 46 in. by $26\frac{1}{2}$ in. weighing not less than $2\frac{3}{4}$ lb. and 48 in. by $26\frac{1}{2}$ in. weighing not less than $2\frac{7}{8}$ lb. may be sold at any place in New Zealand shall be not more than 1s. 3d. per sack when sold by way of sale by retail ex-ship or ex-store main ports.
- 3. The maximum price at which second-hand sacks (commonly known to the grain and seed trade as "once shot" or "double-brushed flour" sacks) size 46 in. by $26\frac{1}{2}$ in. weighing not less than $2\frac{3}{4}$ lb. and 48 in. by $26\frac{1}{2}$ in. weighing not less than $2\frac{7}{8}$ lb. may be sold at any place in New Zealand shall be not more than 1s. 1d. per sack buyer's nearest port when sold by way of sale by wholesale and 1s. 2d. per sack ex-store when sold by way of sale by retail.
- 4. The price at which sound unbrushed flour-sacks may be purchased at any place in New Zealand shall be 11d, per sack ex-bakehouse.
- 5. This Order shall take effect as from the 26th day of February, 1940.
