

## PRICE ORDER NO. 17.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Price Tribunal by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939, and with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:—

(1) This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 17.

(2) The maximum price which may be charged at any place in New Zealand for boot and shoe repairs shall be not more than as follows:—
