PRICE ORDER NO. 28.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Price Tribunal by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939, and with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 28.

2. The maximum price at which Beehive safety matches may be sold by way of retail at any place in New Zealand where a wholesale merchant buying such matches "freight paid" is situated shall be not more than as follows :—

"Outer" lots (one dozen boxes)	8½d.
Four-box lots	3d.
Lesser quantities, per box	1d.

3. At any other place in New Zealand there may be added to the price hereby fixed for "outer" and four-box lots the actual or proportionate amount of any extra freight from such nearest wholesale merchant's store to place of sale.

4. The maximum price at which wooden safety matches of any other brand or description and contained in boxes designed to hold approximately sixty matches may be sold by way of retail at any place in New Zealand when sold in less than the customary packet lots shall be not more than 1d. per box.

5. This Order shall take effect on and from the 10th day of April, 1941.

6. Price Order No. 13 is hereby revoked.
