## PRICE ORDER NO. 29.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Price Tribunal by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939, and with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 29.
- 2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"Said fixed day" means the 28th day of March, 1941.

- "Standard price" in respect of any locality means the current price at which on the said fixed day oats of a given nature and quality were saleable in that locality in given quantities and on given terms as to payment, delivery, or otherwise.
- 3. No firm or person who on the said fixed day was engaged in the business of selling oats shall sell oats of the same nature and quality and on the same terms as to payment, delivery, or otherwise at a price which is higher than the lowest price at which such firm or person sold such oats on the said fixed day or, in the absence of sales on that day, at a price which is higher than the lowest price at which such firm or person last sold such oats.
- 4. No firm or person who commences in any locality to be engaged in the business of selling oats after the said fixed day shall sell such oats in that locality at a price exceeding the standard price thereof on the said fixed day.
