PRICE ORDER NO. 65.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Price Tribunal by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939, and with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 65.

2. This Order relates to the board products manufactured by the Whakatane Paper Mills, Ltd., of Whakatane, and more particularly described in the Schedule hereto.

3. The maximum price at which any board products subject to this Order may be sold in New Zealand shall be not more than the price fixed in the said Schedule, subject, however, to the next succeeding clause hereof.

4. The maximum prices set forth in the said Schedule have been fixed subject to the following terms and conditions :—

- (a) The prices are delivery free on rail to buyer's nearest railway-station in the North Island, or c.i.f. Lyttelton, Dunedin, or Port Chalmers in the South Island, exclusive of war-risk insurance. When buyers request that shipments be insured against war risk the actual extra cost of such insurance may be charged to buyers. Where delivery is made to ports other than the above the actual freight on such shipments may be charged in lieu of the standard allowance for freight :
- (b) The prices apply to orders accepted for delivery in the January-March, 1942, cycle, and thereafter until amended or revoked :
- (c) The prices shall be subject to a rebate of £1 per ton for payment within seven (7) days of delivery :
- (d) The board products shall conform to the standard submitted to and approved by the Price Tribunal :
- (e) The prices are for not less than 3 tons of one size, caliper, and quality, or 5 tons of one caliper and quality and not more than two sizes in one delivery. For 1 to 4 ton orders of a quality in one delivery an additional price of £2 per ton is authorized :
- (f) The size of the board the subject of this Order is as follows :—
 Minimum size : 20 in. by 25 in. :
 Minimum across machine : 20 in. with 25 in. cut off :
 For small sizes down to 15 in. by 20 in. an additional price of £2 per ton is authorized :
- (g) An additional price of £3 per ton is authorized for pasted board (not container board) :

(h) The pasting-machine trims 68 in., and the prices fixed for pasted board and container board are based on full pasting-machine trim. Where orders do not fill the full pasting-machine trim and other suitable sizes are not available to fill such trim an additional charge is authorized for the "broke" arising from such loss of trim, such charge to be the price fixed for pasted board or container board (as the case may be) reduced by £4 11s. 8d. per ton :

(i) Additional prices are authorized for orders on reels requiring slitting and rewinding to reel widths :—

- (1) Between 15 in. and 10 in. £2 per ton.
 (2) Below 10 in. £3 per ton.

5. Price Order No. 59* is hereby revoked.
