PRICE ORDER NO. 8.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Price Tribunal by the Control of Price Emergency Regulations 1939, and with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 8.
- 2. In this Order "prevailing price" means, in relation to the sale of beef, mutton, pork, veal, or lamb (including mince, tripe, and offal from the carcasses, but not including bacon or goods commonly known in the trade as "small-goods"), the price at which such beef, mutton, pork, veal, or lamb was sold by retail on the 19th August, 1940, or, if no sale was made on that date, on the last preceding date on which such sale was made, at the same place and subject to the same terms and conditions.
- 3. The maximum price at which beef, mutton, pork, veal, or lamb (including mince, tripe, and offal from the carcasses, but not including bacon or goods commonly known in the trade as "small-goods") may be sold by retail at any place in New Zealand as from the dates mentioned hereunder shall be not more than the price set out opposite each such date:—

20th August, 1940 ... Prevailing price plus 1d. per pound.
1st November, 1940 ... Prevailing price plus ½d. per pound.

1st December, 1940 .. Prevailing price.

1st January, 1941 ... Prevailing price less ½d. per pound.

4. Price Order No. 5 is hereby revoked.
