

## PRICE ORDER NO. 95

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 95.
- 2. (1) Price Order No. 6† is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the date of this Order.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) hereof, the maximum price or rate at which nails of the gauge or kind mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto may be sold shall be not more than the respective price or rate (according to the quantity sold) set out in the said Schedule opposite each such gauge or kind of nails, according to whether the sale is to a retailer or to a consumer.
- (2) The prices fixed in the said Schedule for sales of less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  cwt. apply at all places in New Zealand. The prices or rates fixed in the said Schedule for sales of not less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  cwt. may, when the sale is made at places other than Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin, be increased by the actual or proportionate amount of extra freight or carriage costs from warehouse into store.
