THE POST OFFICE (POSTAL NOTE) REGULATIONS 1969, AMENDMENT NO. 4

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of March 1979

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Postal Note) Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office (Postal Note) Regulations 1969* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1979.

2. Commission—(1) Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (6) (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Post Office (Postal Note) Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the following subclause:

"(6) A postal note may be issued for one of the amounts specified in the first column of the following table, and in respect of any postal note issued under this regulation the commission specified in the second column of that table shall be payable by its purchaser:

(2) The Post Office (Postal Note) Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 3, are hereby revoked.

3. Affixing of unused postage stamps—Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

"(1) Unused postage stamps (not being fractions of a cent) not exceeding 3 in number and 39c in value may be affixed to the front of the 10c denomination postal note; unused postage stamps (not being fractions of a cent) not exceeding 3 in number and 49c in value may be affixed to the front of the 50c denomination postal note: unused postage stamps (not being fractions of a cent) not exceeding 3 in number and 99c in value may be affixed to the front of all other denominations of postal notes."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations decrease the number of denominations of postal notes.
