ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to section 93 (1) of the Protection of Personal and Property Rights Act 1988, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Protection of Personal and Property Rights (Resealing of Court Orders) Order 1988.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1988.
- 2. Resealing of orders of Australian courts—Section 93 of the Protection of Personal and Property Rights Act 1988 shall apply to Australia.

3. Revocation—The Mental Health (Resealing of Court Orders) Order 1988* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 November 1988, applies section 93 of the Protection of Personal and Property Rights Act 1988 to Australia. The effect is to allow for the resealing in a Court in New Zealand of a copy of any order or declaration made by a court of competent jurisdiction in Australia relating to incapacitated persons or their estates. Once resealed in New Zealand, the order or declaration will have the same effect as if it had been originally made by a Court in New Zealand.
