PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1980.

2. Unauthorised enclosures—Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the following subclause:

“(3) If any person posts a registered publication for transmission at the registered publications rates of postage and the publication contains an enclosure (other than a publication supplement, or a reply card or a reply envelope) emanating from the publisher, the postage payable in respect of the publication shall be that payable in respect of second-class non-standard articles.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations widen the scope of authorised enclosures that can be enclosed in registered publications to include reply cards and envelopes.
