ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1981.

**2. Interpretation**—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term “publication supplement”, and substituting the following definition:

“‘Publication supplement’, in relation to a publication, means a sheet or sheets of paper conforming to such conditions as may from time to time be notified by the Postmaster-General in the *Post Office Guide*”.

**3. Unauthorised enclosures**—(1) Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3) (as substituted by the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the following subclause:

“(3) If any person posts a registered publication for transmission at the registered publications rates of postage and the publication contains an enclosure (other than an enclosure conforming to such requirements as may be notified from time to time by the Postmaster-General in the *Post Office Guide*) emanating from the publisher, the postage payable in respect of the publication shall be that payable in respect of standard articles or second-class non-standard articles.”

(2) The Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3 are hereby revoked.

**4. Inland postage rates and fees for other services**—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by omitting from subparagraph (i) and subparagraph (ii) of clause 2 (4) (b) of the First Schedule (as substituted by regulation 4 (1) of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 4) the expression “33 $\frac{1}{3}$  percent”, and substituting in each case the expression “50 percent”.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1981, amend the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977 to provide for a discount for registered publications of 50 percent, and for the *Post Office Guide* to give particulars of authorised enclosures in respect of registered publications.
