

THE POST OFFICE (INLAND POST) REGULATIONS 1977, AMENDMENT NO. 6

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of January 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1982.
- 2. Weight of postal articles—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 17 (as amended by regulation 5 of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the following regulation:

"17. (1) The maximum weight of any postal article, other than a parcel,

shall be 10 kg:

"Provided that-

- "(a) Any postal article which is paid for at the second class rate prescribed for non-standard articles or registered publications shall not exceed 1 kg in weight:
- "(b) Any postal article upon which the express delivery fee has been paid shall not exceed 3 kg in weight:

- "(c) A householder circular or sample shall not exceed the following weight limits:
 - "(i) For delivery by postman, 50 g:
 - "(ii) For delivery by other means, 100 g:
- "(d) Any postal article posted or to be posted as literature for the blind shall not exceed 7 kg in weight.
- "(2) The maximum weight of any parcel shall be 20 kg, except that parcels weighing in excess of 10 kg will be accepted under such conditions and rates, and at such offices as may be notified from time to time by the Postmaster-General in the Post Office Guide."
- (2) The Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2 are hereby amended by revoking regulation 5.
- 3. Compensation for loss or damage to uninsured parcel—Regulation 48 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 7 of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2) is hereby further amended by omitting the expression "\$20", and substituting the expression "\$40".
- 4. Inland postage rates and fees for other services—(1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the First Schedule (as substituted by regulation 4 (1) of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 4, and amended by regulation 4 of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 5), and substituting the new First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
 - (2) The following regulations are hereby revoked:
 - (a) Regulation 4 of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 4, and the Schedule thereto:
 - (b) Regulation 4 of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 5.

- (6) Parcels—The postage rates for parcels are assessed on the basis of the following zones:
 (a) Zone 1—Postal Districts of Whangarei, Auckland, Hamilton, Thames, Tauranga,
- (a) Zone 1—Postal Districts of Whangarei, Auckland, Hamilton, Thames, Tauranga, Rotorua, and Gisborne.
- (b) Zone 2—Postal Districts of New Plymouth, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Napier, Masterton, and Wellington.
- (c) Zone 3—Postal Districts of Blenheim, Nelson, Westport, Greymouth, Christchurch, and Timaru.
- (d) Zone 4—Postal Districts of Oamaru, Dunedin, and Invercargill.

The "local delivery" rates apply to parcels delivered from the office of posting or within a radius of 10 km.

The "within a zone" rates apply to parcels being exchanged between postal districts within a parcel zone, or between postal districts having a common boundary when they are in separate parcel zones.

(7) Bulk mail-

- (a) The following postage is payable in respect of bulk mail postings of standard letters, or non-standard second-class articles, comprising 3,000 articles or more, which meet such conditions as may from time to time be notified by the Postmaster-General in the Post Office Guide:

NOTE—The rural mail delivery fee is charged for a rural private bag when the customer does not have the option of rural delivery service.

- (14) Rural mail service charges—
- (a) For delivery 3 times weekly or less \$8.50 a year.
 (b) For delivery more than 3 times weekly ... \$17 a year.
- (15) Redirection orders—A charge of \$12.50 is payable in respect of each renewal of a redirection order after a period of 12 months.
- (16) Surcharge on unpaid or underpaid mail—The fee payable, in addition to the deficient postage in respect of unpaid or underpaid postal articles, is 20c per article.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which take effect on 1 April 1982,-

(a) Prescribe new postage rates:

(c) Introduce discounts for postings of promotional articles of between 1,000 and 3,000

(d) Liberalise the requirements for bulk parcel discounts:

- (f) Increase the amount of compensation for the loss of or damage to an uninsured parcel:

(g) Extend the qualifying period for the Christmas card rate:
