HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) Subject to subclause (3) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the 2nd day of February 1987.

(1) Letters

- (3) Regulation 3 of these regulations shall come into force on the 31st day of March 1987.
- 2. First Schedule—For the period commencing on the 2nd day of February 1987 and ending with the 30th day of March 1987, the First Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 4 (1) of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 8) shall be read as if there had been substituted for clauses 1, 2, and subclauses (1) to (11), (15), and (16) of clause 3 of that Schedule, clauses 1, 2, and subclauses (1) to (10), (14), and (15) of clause 3 of the new First Schedule to the principal regulations, as set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
- 8. Inland postage rates and fees for other services—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule (as substituted by regulation 4 (1) of the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 8), and substituting the new First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) The Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 8 are hereby consequentially amended by revoking regulation 4 and the Schedule thereto.
- (3) All inland postage rates and fees for other services are inclusive of goods and services tax.

- (a) The following postage is payable in respect of bulk mail postings of standard letters, or non-standard second-class articles, comprising 3000 articles or more, which meet such conditions as may from time to time be notified by the Postmaster-General in the Postal Users Guide:
 - (i) General postings—For standard letters presorted by the sender into—

- (c) The following postage is payable in respect of bulk mail postings of 500 parcels or more, within a period of one week, which meet such conditions as may from time to time be notified by the Postmaster-General in the Postal Users Guide:

- **3. Miscellaneous rates and charges**—The following miscellaneous rates and charges shall be payable:
- (1) Fee for registration of a publication—A fee of \$40 is payable upon the initial registration of a publication. A further fee of \$30 is payable in respect of each annual renewal of registration.
- (2) Literature for the blind—No postage is payable in respect of literature posted for blind persons if the article weighs not more than 7 kg.
- (3) Express delivery packages—The fee payable in respect of packages delivered by express delivery up to 5 km is \$1.80 in addition to postage.
- (4) Business reply and Freepost—The following charges shall be payable in addition to postage in respect of items sent "business reply post" or "freepost":
 - (a) For 500 or more items per month to the same addressee provided such conditions as may be notified from time to time by the Postmaster-General in the Postal Users Guide are met
- (5) Insurance—The following fees are payable, in addition to postage, in respect of insured articles:
 - (a) For any article insured for an amount up to \$100 \$3.80
 - (b) For each additional \$50 of insurance cover or fraction thereof up to a maximum of \$1,000 ... 35c.
- (6) Registration—The fee payable, in addition to postage, in respect of registered letters is \$2.45.
 - (7) Advice of delivery of a registered or insured article—
 - (a) The charge payable in respect of an advice of delivery of a registered or an insured article is \$1.70:
 - (b) The charge payable for obtaining a certificate of delivery of a registered or an insured article up to 1 year after the date of posting is \$2.45.
- (8) Late fee—The late fee payable in respect of a letter is 40c in addition to postage.
- (9) Storage—The following storage fees are payable in respect of postal articles:
 - (a) If the article is collected within 5 working days after the end of the free storage period day:
 - (b) If the article is collected after the expiration of the period referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause for each day beyond the expiration of the free storage period, including weekends and public holidays

- (10) Pharmaceutical requirements—For each package of pharmaceutical requirements posted by a pharmacist under the Social Security (Pharmaceutical Benefits) Regulations 1965 a fee of 35c additional to postage shall be payable by the addressee.
- (11) Private letterbox rental rates—The following charges are payable in respect of the renting of private letterboxes:

There is also payable under subparagraph (a) (ii) of this paragraph, a delivery charge of \$450 per annum for each closing a day if the bagholder resides within 5 kilometres of the delivery office, a further \$560 per annum for each closing a day if the bagholder resides between 5 and 10 kilometres of the delivery office, and an additional charge of \$180 per annum for each additional kilometre or part thereof of delivery:

(b) The fee for a private bag for the delivery of correspondence to an address that is outside an area served by a postman's delivery shall be as follows:

NOTE—The rural mail delivery fee is charged for a rural private bag when the customer does not have the option of rural delivery service.

- (13) Rural mail service charges—
- (a) For delivery 3 times weekly or less
- \$15.00 a year: (b) For delivery more than 3 times weekly \$30.00 a year.
- (14) Redirection orders—A charge of \$25.00 is payable in respect of each renewal of a redirection order after a period of 12 months.
- (15) Surcharge on unpaid or underpaid mail—The fee payable, in addition to the deficient postage in respect of unpaid or underpaid postal articles, is 40c per article.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 2 February 1987, amend the Post Office (Inland Post) Regulations 1977 to—

- (a) Prescribe new rates for inland postage and miscellaneous postal services:
- (b) Prescribe new rates for private letterboxes, private mail bags, and rural mail services with effect from 31 March 1987.
