**THE POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK REGULATIONS 1944,
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of July 1952

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office Savings Bank Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office Savings Bank Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 66 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subclause (1) the following words:—

“Ledgers and ledger cards relating to savings bank accounts
which have been closed 15

“Ledgers and ledger cards which have been filled 15”

3. The regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Act 1908 on the 3rd day of July 1916, and published in the *Gazette* of the 6th day of July 1916 on page 2302, are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

The effect of the regulations is to authorize the destruction of any documents referred to in regulation 2 after fifteen years from the last entry on the document.
