THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) Except as otherwise provided, these regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 14th day of September 1966.

2. Overtime payments at time and a half rate—Regulation 39 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 24) is hereby further amended by revoking the proviso to subclause (1), and substituting the following proviso:

“Provided that—

- “(a) During the period commencing with the 14th day of September 1966 and ending with the 31st day of July 1967 the minimum rate shall be 5s. 10d. an hour or, as the case may require, \$0.581 an hour, and from and including the 1st day of August 1967 it shall be \$0.585 an hour; and
- “(b) During the period commencing with the 14th day of September 1966 and ending with the 31st day of March 1967 the maximum rate shall be £1 7s. 6d. an hour; during the period commencing with the 1st day of April 1967 and ending with the 31st day of July 1967 it shall be £1 7s. 9½d. an hour or, as the case may require, \$2.777 an hour; during the period commencing with the 1st day of August 1967 and ending with the 31st day of March 1968 it shall be \$2.806 an hour; and from and including the 1st day of April 1968 it shall be \$2.835 an hour.”

3. Overtime payments at double-time rates—Regulation 40 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 3 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 24) is hereby further amended by revoking the proviso to subclause (1) and substituting the following proviso:

“Provided that—

- “(a) During the period commencing with the 14th day of September 1966 and ending with the 31st day of July 1967 the minimum rate shall be 7s. 9½d. an hour or, as the case may require, \$0.775 an hour, and from and including the 1st day of August 1967 it shall be \$0.780 an hour; and
- “(b) During the period commencing with the 14th day of September 1966 and ending with the 31st day of March 1967 the maximum rate shall be £1 7s. 6d. an hour; during the period commencing with the 1st day of April 1967 and ending with the 31st day of July 1967 it shall be £1 7s. 9½d. an hour or, as the case may require, \$2.777 an hour; during the period commencing with the 1st day of August 1967 and ending with the 31st day of March 1968 it shall be \$2.806 an hour; and from and including the 1st day of April 1968 it shall be \$2.835 an hour.”

4. Maximum salary including overtime payments—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 53 (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 24), and substituting the following regulation:

“53 (1) Subject to the provisions of subclauses (4) and (5) of this regulation, the total amount of salary and overtime payable to any employee in respect of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1967 shall not exceed the following:

“(2) Subject to the provisions of subclause (5) of this regulation, the total amount of salary and overtime payable to any employee in respect of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1968 shall not exceed the following:

“(3) Subject to the provisions of subclause (5) of this regulation, the total amount of salary and overtime payable to any employee in respect of any year ending with the 31st day of March in any year after the year 1968 shall not exceed the following:

“(4) Subject to the provisions of subclause (5) of this regulation, the total amount of salary and overtime payable to any employee in respect of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1967 shall not exceed the following:

“Provided that for the purposes of this subclause, overtime shall include that worked in the circumstances specified in subclause (2) of regulation 39 and subclause (2) of regulation 40 of these regulations, and payment for penal duty shall be in accordance with the appropriate regulations.

“(5) The Director-General may from time to time expressly, and either specifically in any particular case or generally, direct that overtime and payments for Saturday sixth shift duty be made either at the hourly rate of payment applicable or by way of a lump-sum allowance notwithstanding that any such direction would cause the total emolument of an employee to exceed in any year ending with the 31st day of March the amount specified in this regulation:

“Provided that any amount paid as a lump-sum allowance under this subclause shall not exceed the amount which would have been payable had the time worked as overtime or as a Saturday sixth shift been paid for at the appropriate hourly rate.”

5. Travelling allowances—Regulation 61 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (2), (2A), and (2B) (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 24), and substituting the following subclauses:

7. Allowance for foreman in charge—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 67, and substituting the following heading and regulation:

“Allowance for Foreman or Technician in Charge

“67. Any foreman or other employee acting as a foreman who is in charge of a party of workmen employed in the construction and maintenance branch or a buildings maintenance party and who is working in a locality from which he is unable to return to his headquarters at night may be paid an allowance of 20c for each day he and the party are in camp or board and lodgings. In similar circumstances, a technician in charge of a party may be paid the same allowance as is payable under this regulation to a foreman.”

(2) Regulation 15 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No 3, is hereby revoked.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of June 1967.

8. Meal allowance—(1) Regulation 68 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (2) and (2A) (as amended by regulation 7 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 21), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) The amount of the meal allowance shall be 78 cents.”

(2) Regulation 7 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 21, is hereby revoked.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of November 1967.

9. Bicycle allowance—(1) Regulation 71 of the principal regulations is amended by omitting from paragraph (b) the words “ $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. an hour of”, and substituting the words “2d. an hour or, as the case may require, \$0.0167 an hour in respect of”.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1963.

10. Salary rates in respect of period 1 April 1966 to 13 September 1966—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules thereto (as substituted by regulation 8 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 24), and substituting the schedules set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1966.

(3) This regulation and the First Schedule to these regulations shall continue in force until the 13th day of September 1966 and shall then be deemed to have expired.

11. Salary rates in respect of period 14 September 1966 to 31 March 1967—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules thereto, and substituting the schedules set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 14th day of September 1966.

(3) This regulation and the Second Schedule to these regulations shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1967 and shall then be deemed to have expired.

12. Salary rates in respect of period 1 April 1967 to 31 July 1967—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules thereto, and substituting the schedules set out in the Third Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1967.

(3) This regulation and the Third Schedule to these regulations shall continue in force until the 31st day of July 1967 and shall then be deemed to have expired.

13. Salary rates in respect of period 1 August 1967 to 31 March 1968—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules thereto, and substituting the schedules set out in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1967.

(3) This regulation and the Fourth Schedule to these regulations shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1968 and shall then be deemed to have expired.

14. Salary rates on and after 1 April 1968—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules thereto, and substituting the schedules set out in the Fifth Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1968.

15. Revocation—The Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 24 are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of this amendment is to increase certain Post Office salary scales as from and including 1 April 1966, 14 September 1966, 1 April 1967, 1 August 1967, and 1 April 1968, and to increase Post Office travelling and relieving allowances and meal money from 1 November 1967.

The increases arise out of a new scale for Engineers in the State Services, surveys of Ruling Rates in Industry, and recommendations made by the Advisory Committee on higher salaries in the State Services.

The amendment also covers salary changes where they appear in allowance regulations and limitations in earnings, and provides for an increase in postmen's bicycle allowance.
