

# THE POST OFFICE STAFF REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 27

Present:
His Excellency the Governor-General in Coungil
Pursuant to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the GovernorGeneral, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement- (1) These regulations may be cited as the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 27, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of August 1968.
2. Overtime payments at time and a half rate-Regulation 39 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25) is hereby further amended by revoking the proviso to subclause (1), and substituting the following proviso:
"Provided that-
"(a) From and including the 12th day of August 1968 the minimum rate shall be $\$ 0.625$ an hour; and

"(b) From and including the 12th day of August 1968 the maximum rate shall be $\$ 2.988$ an hour."
(2) Regulation 2 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25, is hereby consequentially revoked.
3. Overtime payments at double-time rates-(1) Regulation 40 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 3 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25) is hereby further amended by revoking the proviso to subclause (1), and substituting the following proviso:
"Provided that-
"(a) From and including the 12th day of August 1968 the minimum rate shall be $\$ 0.833$ an hour; and
"(b) From and including the 12th day of August 1968 the maximum rate shall be $\$ 2.988$ an hour."
(2) Regulation 3 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25, is hereby consequentially revoked.
4. Maximum salary including overtime payments-(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 53 (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25), and substituting the following regulation:
"53 (1) Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) of this regulation, the total amount of salary and overtime payable to any employee in respect of any year ending with the 31st day of March shall not exceed the following:

"(2) The Director-General may from time to time expressly, either specifically in any particular case or generally, direct that overtime and payments for Saturday sixth shift duty be made either at the hourly rate of payment applicable or by way of a lump-sum allowance notwithstanding that any such direction would cause the total emolument of an employee to exceed in any year ending with the 31st day of March the limit specified in subclause (1) of this regulation:
"Provided that any amount paid as a lump-sum allowance under this subclause shall not exceed the amount which would have been payable had the time worked as overtime or as a Saturday sixth shift been paid for at the appropriate hourly rate."
(2) Regulation 4 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25, is hereby consequentially revoked.
5. Travelling allowances-(1) Regulation 61 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (2), (2A), (2b), (2c), and (2D) (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25), and substituting the following subclause:
"(2) The scales of travelling allowance from and including the 12th day of August 1968 shall be as follows:
"Scale I-For Absence Otherwise Than on a Sea Voyage Extending Over More Than 24 Hours

"If an employee spends only 1 night at a lodging place, he shall be entitled to a refund of the actual hotel surcharge (if any).
"Scale II—For Absence on a Sea Voyage Extending Over More Than 24 Hours
"Instead of the sums prescribed in Scale I, an employee shall be entitled to a travelling allowance of-

(2) Regulation 5 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25, is hereby consequentially revoked.
6. Relieving allowance-(1) Regulation 62 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (3), (3A), (3c), and (3D) (as substituted by regulation 6 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25), and substituting the following subclause:
"(3) The scale of relieving allowances from and including the 12th day of Augus't 1968 shall be as follows:

(2) Regulation 6 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 25, is hereby consequentially revoked.
7. Salary rates from and including 12 August 1968-(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First, Second, and Third Schedules (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 26), and substituting the Schedules set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
(2) Regulation 5 of the Post Office Staff Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 26, is hereby consequentially revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of this amendment is to increase certain Post Office salary scales as from and including 12 August 1968. The increases arise out of a survey of ruling rates in industry.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.
Date of notification in Gazette: 11 September 1969.
These regulations are administered in the Post Office.
