ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 13th day of December, 1939.

PURSUANT to section 8 of the Coroners Amendment Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Payment of Witnesses (Coroners) Regulations 1939.
- 2. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1940.
- 3. The regulations under the above-mentioned section, published in the *Gazette* on the 20th day of October, 1932, at page 2133, are hereby revoked.
- 4. The sum which a Coroner may order to be paid to a witness (other than a medical witness) for attending to give evidence at an inquest may be a sum not exceeding the amount that would be payable to such witness if his attendance had been as a witness for the Crown in a criminal case in accordance with the regulations for the time being in force for the payment of witnesses for the Crown in criminal cases.
