PURSUANT to section 53 of the Pesticides Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

---

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pesticides (Vertebrate Pest Control) Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pesticides (Vertebrate Pest Control) Regulations 1983\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1985.

**2. Fees**—(1) Regulation 11 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “\$20”, and substituting the expression “\$40”.

(2) Regulation 11 (2) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “\$20”, and substituting the expression “\$40”.

(3) Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking subclauses (3) and (4).

(4) Form 1 in the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “\$20”, and substituting the expression “\$40”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations—

- (a) Increase from \$20 to \$40 the fee payable on an application for a licence to apply or otherwise use a controlled pesticide under Part V of the Pesticides Act 1979; and
- (b) Increase from \$20 to \$40 the fee payable on an application for a variation of the terms or conditions of any such licence; and
- (c) Remove the present exemption from such fees enjoyed by land owners using phosphorised paste supplied by Pest Destruction Boards, and employees of Government departments and public bodies where such a licence is required in connection with their official duties.
