HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 53 of the Pesticides Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Agriculture tendered on the recommendation of the Pesticides Board and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pesticides (Vertebrate Pest Control) Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pesticides (Vertebrate Pest Control) Regulations 1983* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1988.

2. Fees—Regulation 11 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Pesticides (Vertebrate Pest Control) Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended by omitting the expression “\$70”

in both places where it occurs, and substituting in each case the expression "\$90".

3. Amount of goods and services tax excluded—The fees fixed by these regulations are exclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1988, increase from \$70 to \$90 the fee payable on application for the issue or variation of a licence under Part V of the Pesticides Act 1979.

The fees are exclusive of goods and services tax.
