**THE PLANT QUARANTINE REGULATIONS 1957,
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 28th day of June 1967

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Plant Quarantine Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Plant Quarantine Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Inspection fee—(1) Subclause (2) of regulation 41 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “1d.”, and substituting the expression “1c”.

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 10th day of July 1967.

3. New Fourth Schedule—(1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Fourth Schedule, and substituting the Fourth Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of the month following the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE

Reg. 3 "FOURTH SCHEDULE
Regs. 42 and 43SCALE OF FEES FOR FUMIGATION, DESTRUCTION, AND OTHER TREATMENT
OF IMPORTED FRUIT, GOODS, PLANTS, AND SEEDS, AND INSPECTION OF
QUARANTINE SEED POTATOES AND NURSERY STOCK.

1. For fumigation or other treatment:

(a) Fruit (fresh or dried) contained in packages which are customarily used for the type of fruit—

First 100 packages	1s.	(10c)	a package.
All in excess of 100	6d.	(5c)	a package.
Minimum charge	5s.	(50c).	

(b) Seeds, grain, and other goods in sacks or bags—

First 30 packages	3s.	(30c)	a package.
All in excess of 30	1s. 6d.	(15c)	a package.
Minimum charge	5s.	(50c).	

(c) Plants and other goods in containers other than sacks or bags—also fruit (fresh or dried) in packages other than those customarily used for the type of fruit—

(i) Not exceeding 3 cubic feet	5	0	(50)

(ii) Where consignment exceeds 3

cubic feet, as follows:

Each 10 cubic feet or part up to 100 cubic feet	9	0	(90)

2. For destruction of a consignment or part consignment of goods—
