### THE PLUMBERS REGULATIONS 1931, AMENDMENT NO. 11

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Plumbers Registration Act, 1912, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations for matters which have been deemed by the Plumbers Board of New Zealand necessary or expedient to give effect to the said Act.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Plumbers Regulations 1931, Amendment No. 11.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Plumbers Regulations 1931\* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1947.
- 4. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words "one calendar month" in clause 3 thereof, and substituting the words "six weeks".
- 5. Section (B) of the First Schedule to the principal regulations, as substituted by Regulation 5 of the Plumbers Regulations 1931, Amendment No. 2†, is revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

#### "(B) Practical Test in Workmanship

- "This Part will be of an advanced character and will be such as to show that the candidate can execute in a satisfactory manner within a reasonable time the following practical plumbing work:—
  - "(a) Lead burning, lead-pipe bending, sheet-lead bossing, joint-wiping:
  - "(b) Copper and other metal pipe bending, jointing, welding, and brazing.

"No springs are allowed for pipe-bending, but heat is allowed, and any means of heat must be supplied by the candidate.

"In wiping a solder joint to a lead pipe, where one or both of the pipes in the joint have a diameter of less than 3 in., heat must be applied by means of hot metal alone.

"In wiping a solder joint to a lead pipe where both pipes in the joint have a diameter of 3 in. or more, heat may be applied by means of a blow-lamp or other means approved by the Board."
