THE PLUMBERS REGULATIONS 1931, AMENDMENT NO. 7.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of
September, 1940.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Plumbers Registration Act, 1912, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations for matters which have been deemed by the Plumbers Board of New Zealand necessary or expedient to give effect to the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Plumbers Regulations 1931, Amendment No. 7.

2. These regulations shall be read with and form part of the Plumbers Regulations 1931* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by adding thereto the following additional clause:—

“(8) The Board may in its discretion permit any person who has been accepted for service overseas with any of His Majesty’s Forces and who is otherwise eligible to present himself for the examination or either part thereof, notwithstanding that he may not have completed the respective period of service as an apprentice or the respective period of engagement in the plumbing trade specified in the last preceding clause of this regulation.”
