**THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 10**

COBHAM, Governor-General

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of May 1962

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in accordance with recommendations made by the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand and transmitted by the Board to the Minister of Health, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Subclause (3) of regulation 37 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 4) is hereby amended by adding the following provisos:

“Provided that where a candidate obtains at least 50 per cent in the subject of Practical Pharmacy and in two other subjects of the examination and not less than 40 per cent but less than 50 per cent in the remaining subject, he may, subject to the approval of the Board, be permitted to sit a special examination in that remaining subject at a time and place to be determined by the Board, and upon obtaining at least 50 per cent at the special examination he shall be granted a pass of the Section C Examination:

“Provided also that if a candidate fails to gain a pass at any such special examination he shall be required to present himself for re-examination in all subjects of the Section C Examination.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations permit candidates in the Section C Examination who have failed by not more than 10 per cent in one subject (not being Practical Pharmacy) to sit a special examination in that subject and, if successful, to be credited with a pass in all subjects.
