THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944,
AMENDMENT NO. 13

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 2nd day of December 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with recommendations made by the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand and transmitted by the Board to the Minister of Health, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 13, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 8 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 11, is hereby amended by adding, as subclauses (2) and (3), the following subclauses:

“(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this regulation, any candidate to whom those provisions apply who obtains at least 50 per cent in any three subjects of the examination and not less than 40 per cent but less than 50 per cent in the remaining subject may, subject to the approval of the Board, be permitted to sit a special examination in that remaining subject at a time and place to be determined by the Board, and, upon obtaining at least 50 per cent at the special examination, he shall be granted a pass of the Section C Examination.

“(3) If any such candidate fails to gain a pass at any such special examination he shall be required to present himself for re-examination in all subjects of the Section C Examination.”

(2) For the purposes of regulation 8 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 11, the provisos to subclause (3) of regulation 37 of the principal regulations (as added by regulation 2 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 10) shall have no application with respect to any person to whom subclause (3) of section 3 of the Pharmacy Amendment Act 1959 applies.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of these regulations is that candidates sitting the Section C Examinations under the old syllabus and passing three subjects and gaining 40 per cent or more in the fourth may sit a special examination in the fourth subject.

Previously a pass in the subject “practical pharmacy” was obligatory.
