THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 16

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of March 1970

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 16, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1970.

2. Place of practical training—(1) Regulation 34 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 7 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 15) is hereby amended by adding to paragraph (b) of subclause (1) the words “other than a hospital transferred to the Hospital Board under section 7 of the Mental Health Act 1969”.

(2) The said regulation 34, as so amended, is hereby further amended by adding to subclause (1) the following paragraph:

“(f) The pharmacy department of a hospital within the meaning of the Mental Health Act 1969, but not being an institution to which paragraph (b) of this subclause applies, approved in that behalf by the Board.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Pharmacy Regulations 1944 to enable practical training in pharmacy to be undertaken in those psychiatric hospitals and institutions which are approved in that behalf by the Pharmacy Board.
