THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 17

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 8th day of February 1971

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 17, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Practising fees—Regulation 19 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 15) is hereby amended by adding to the proviso the following paragraph:

“(c) A chemist who satisfies the Registrar that he is no longer substantially engaged in pharmaceutical practice shall pay an annual practising fee of \$5.00.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Pharmacy Regulations 1944. The annual practising fee payable by a chemist who satisfies the Registrar that he is no longer substantially engaged in pharmaceutical practice is reduced from \$10 to \$5.
