



THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 19

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 19, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1972.

2. Practising fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 19 (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 15, and amended by regulation 2 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 17), and substituting the following regulation:

“19. The annual practising fee payable to the Society by every chemist shall be the sum of \$15:

“Provided that—

“(a) A chemist who satisfies the Registrar that he has attained the age of 65 years shall pay an annual practising fee of \$7.50:

“(b) A chemist who satisfies the Registrar that he is not resident in New Zealand shall pay an annual practising fee of \$7.50:

“(c) A chemist who satisfies the Registrar that he is no longer substantially engaged in pharmaceutical practice shall pay an annual practising fee of \$7.50.”

3. Consequential revocations—The following regulations are hereby consequentially revoked—

(a) Regulation 3 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 15:

(b) The Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 17.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Pharmacy Regulations 1944 by increasing the annual practising fees payable by chemists.
