THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 2

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Pharmacy Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in accordance with recommendations made by the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand and transmitted by the Board to the Minister of Health, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Regulation 33 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso thereto:—
- "Provided that where two or more chemists are engaged in the establishment one more apprentice (being a discharged serviceman within the meaning of Part I of the Rehabilitation Act, 1941) than the maximum number prescribed in the foregoing provisions of this regulation may be employed in the establishment."
