THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 8

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 10th day of July 1957

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1938, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in accordance with recommendations made by the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand and transmitted by the Board to the Minister of Health, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 33 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "six more months", and substituting the words "twelve more months".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of the amendment made by these regulations is that any apprentice who is in the last twelve months of his apprenticeship will be excluded from the number of apprentices which may be employed in a pharmacy. The provision previously applied only to apprentices in the last six months of their apprenticeship.
