**THE POISONS (LICENSING) REGULATIONS 1951,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of July 1954

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Poisons Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Poisons (Licensing) Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Poisons (Licensing) Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "such one of the forms numbered 1 to 6 in the First Schedule hereto as may be appropriate", and substituting the words "a form to be provided by the Registrar".

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 7, and substituting the following regulation:

"7. Every licence shall be in a form to be prescribed by the Registrar."

4. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "of the certificate set out in the forms numbered 5 and 6 in the First Schedule hereto", and substituting the words "that the applicant is well known to the person giving the certificate and is of good character and sober habits and is considered by him to be a fit person to be allowed to sell poisons".

5. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the First Schedule.

6. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) By adding to Group I the words “(c) Phenylbutazone”:
- (b) By revoking Group X.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations allow the Registrar under the Poisons Act 1934 (the Director-General of Health) to prescribe the forms of licences and applications for licences under that Act, in substitution for the forms at present prescribed by the Poisons (Licensing) Regulations 1951. They also amend the Second Schedule to those regulations (being the list of poisons that the holder of a storekeeper's extended poison licence may not sell by retail), so as to make it the same as the list of prescription poisons under the Act.
