**THE PLUMBERS REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Plumbers Registration Act 1912, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Plumbers Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Plumbers Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) The Waikato County is hereby declared to be a district within which, on and after the expiration of six months from the date of the coming into force of these regulations, all sanitary plumbing shall be done by registered plumbers.

(2) Part VI of the Third Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby accordingly amended by inserting, after the word "Paparua", the word "Waikato".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

The effect of these regulations is that, on and after the expiration of six months from the date of the coming into force of these regulations, all sanitary plumbing in the County of Waikato must be done by registered plumbers.
