PURSUANT to the Physiotherapy Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1966.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the definition of the term "Principal", and substituting the following definition:

" 'Principal' means the person at a principal training school in charge of the training of student physiotherapists: ".

3. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclauses (1) and (2) (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 1) the expression "£1 1s." in each of the four places in which it occurs, and substituting in each case the expression "£1 15s."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the fee payable in respect of each subsection of the State Examination in Physiotherapy from £1 1s. to £1 15s. The opportunity has been taken of removing an ambiguity in the definition of the term "principal".
