ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 17th day of April 1978

THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Physiotherapy Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. **Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1978.

2. **Period of training**—Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 6) the expression "108 weeks", and substituting the expression "not less than 108 weeks and not more than 132 weeks, as the Board from time to time determines".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the Physiotherapy Regulations 1953.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement.

Regulation 2 amends regulation 3 (1) of the principal regulations, which prescribes the period of practical training to be undertaken by a candidate for registration as a physiotherapist who has passed the prescribed examinations in New Zealand. At present, the period is 108 weeks. The amendment substitutes a minimum period of 108 weeks and a maximum of 132 weeks, the actual period to be determined from time to time by the Physiotherapy Board within those limits.
