THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 10

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of July 1965

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) Regulations 2 and 3 of these regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of May 1965, and regulation 6 of these regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 26th day of August 1964.

2. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subclause (2), the following subclause:

“(2A) The Commissioner shall appoint a monitor or monitors for each examination who shall read each examination paper and settle with the examiners the form and content of the examination papers and the basis on which the papers are marked. In the event of a disagreement between a monitor and an examiner, the matter shall be referred to the Commissioner who shall make such decision as he considers fair and equitable in the circumstances and whose decision shall be final.”

3. (1) Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (5), and substituting the following subclause.

“(5) The law examination shall consist of the following subjects—

“(a) Evidence:

“(b) Statutes:

“(c) Police administration:

“(d) Practical police duties—

within such limits for each subject as may be prescribed in general instructions.”

(2) Subclause (6) of regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “in collaboration with a Magistrate or solicitor appointed by the Commissioner”.

(3) Subclause (7) of regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “60 per cent”, and substituting the words “50 per cent”.

(4) Subclause (1) of regulation 4 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 9, is hereby revoked.

4. Subclause (2) of regulation 20 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 4 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 7) is hereby further amended by adding the following additional proviso:

“Provided also that where an appeal under section 14 of the Act is made in respect of any recommendation for appointment, the date of appointment of any member appointed following the appeal, whether the appellant or the member originally recommended for appointment, shall, for the purposes of determining seniority, be the fifteenth day after the date of the recommendation appealed against.”

5. Regulation 57 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the word “correspondence” wherever that word occurs.

6. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule thereto, and substituting the new Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 9 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 9 and the Second Schedule to those regulations are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2 provides for the appointment of monitors to settle the form and content of examination papers and the basis for marking papers.

Regulation 3 prescribes the subjects for the law examination.

Regulation 4 prescribes the date on which an appointment is deemed to commence, for the purpose of determining seniority, following an appeal.

Regulation 5: The effect of the amendment is that the existing correspondence course of instruction will be replaced by a course of instruction not by correspondence.

Regulation 6 prescribes new rates of pay and allowances.
