THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 11

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 11th day of July 1966

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 11, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 42, the following regulation:

“42A. **Duties in connection with youth clubs**—The Minister on the recommendation of the Commissioner may appoint any member of the Juvenile Crime Prevention Section to perform specified duties at any Police-Citizens youth club, if the club so desires, for the direction and education of members of the club.

3. Regulation 60 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

“(5) Where no entry has been made on a member’s defaulter sheet during a period of seven years, all entries on that sheet relating to any period before the commencement of the period of seven years shall be deemed to be expunged.”

4. Subclause (1) of regulation 76 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “28 days a year inclusive of the weekly days off”, and substituting the words “27 days a year exclusive of the weekly days off”.

5. Regulation 86 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "pursuant to section 9 (1) or section 15 of the Act".

6. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 93, the following regulation:

"93A. **Limitation of authority of Police Staff Tribunal**—No principal order shall be made by the Police Staff Tribunal in respect of remuneration payable to any member above the rank of Superintendent."

7. (1) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking Parts 1 and 2 of the Second Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 6 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 10), and substituting the Parts 1 and 2 set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 26th day of August 1964.

8. (1) The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from Part 1 thereof the paragraphs relating to Chief Superintendents and Assistant Commissioners, and substituting the following paragraphs:

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1965.

9. (1) The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the heading to Part 1 thereof, and substituting the heading: "*Part 1—Pay of Members (other than Matrons)*".

(2) The said Second Schedule is hereby further amended by revoking Part 2 thereof, and substituting the Part 2 set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of November 1965.
