THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 1

COBHAM, Governor-General

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 1st day of September 1959

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1958.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by repealing the Second Schedule, and substituting the Schedule to these regulations.
