



## THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 2

COBHAM, Governor-General

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 16th day of December 1959

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of October 1959.

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule, as substituted by the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 1, and substituting the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 1, are hereby revoked.
