HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2) and substituting the Schedule set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) The Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2, are hereby revoked.
- (3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1960.
- (4) This regulation and the First Schedule to these regulations shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1961 and shall then expire.
- 3. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule thereto, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
  - (2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1961.
