THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 3

COBHAM, Governor-General

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 18th day of January 1961

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2) and substituting the Schedule set out in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2, are hereby revoked.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April 1960.

(4) This regulation and the First Schedule to these regulations shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1961 and shall then expire.

3. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule thereto, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations.

(2) This regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1961.
