

# THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 6

# COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 5th day of March 1962

### Present:

THE RIGHT HON, KEITH HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1961.
- 2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 3) and substituting the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 3, and regulation 4 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 4, are hereby revoked.
