THE POLICE REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 8

BERNARD FERGUSSON, Governor-General

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 18th day of November 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Police Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Subclause (5) of regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "Promotion Board", the words "or, in the case of an appeal against a decision of the Promotion Board, of the Appeal Board,".

3. (1) Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (8), and substituting the following subclause:

"(8) A candidate shall be credited with a pass in any subject or subjects in respect of which he obtains a pass at any examination."

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of September 1963.

4. Regulation 49 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subclause (2), the following subclause:

"(2A) The Tribunal hearing any charge may dismiss the charge where it appears that a member has been unfairly prejudiced through his not being informed as soon as practicable that he was to be reported."

5. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule thereto (as substituted by regulation 14 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 7) and substituting the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 14 of the Police Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 7, is hereby revoked.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1962: Provided that nothing in the foregoing part of this subclause shall apply to the item in Part 2 of the Schedule hereto fixing a rate of pay in respect of members under the age of 21 years.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 2: The effect of the amendment is that where a decision of the Promotion Board is appealed against, the opinion as to whether or not any conduct is serious misconduct or neglect of duty shall, for the purposes of the regulation amended, be that of the Appeal Board.

Regulation 3 provides that a pass in any subject in the law examination shall be credited to the candidate. Previously a candidate was required in his first examination to pass in two subjects before he was credited with a pass in any subject.

Regulation 4 empowers a Tribunal hearing a charge to dismiss the charge if it appears that the member charged was prejudiced by failure to comply with certain specified requirements.

Regulation 5 prescribes new wage scales for members of the Police.
