



## THE POISONS REGULATIONS 1964, AMENDMENT NO. 10

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 4th day of June 1974

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Poisons Act 1960, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Poisons Regulations 1964\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Amendment to Second Schedule to principal regulations**—The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the item “Phenacetin” (as inserted by regulation 9 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 9).

**3. New prescription poison**—(1) Subject to the proviso to regulation 7 of the principal regulations (as inserted by regulation 2 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 3), the substance named in the Schedule to these regulations is hereby declared to be a prescription poison which may be sold by retail only pursuant to a prescription of a medical practitioner, dentist, or veterinary surgeon.

(2) Part I of the Seventh Schedule to the principal regulations (as amended by regulations 12 and 13 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 1, by regulations 13 and 14 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 2, by regulations 16 and 17 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 3, by regulations 9 and 10 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 4, by regulations 12 and 13 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 5, by regulations 10 and 11 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 6, by regulation 4 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 8, and by regulations 16 and 17 of the Poisons Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 9), is hereby further amended by inserting in its appropriate alphabetical order, the name of the substance declared to be a prescription poison by subclause (1) of this regulation.

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#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, declare phenacetin to be a prescription poison.
