



**THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1975,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 4th day of December 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1979.

2. Annual practising fee—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 26, and substituting the following regulation:

“26. (1) Subject to subclauses (2) and (3) of this regulation, every pharmacist shall pay to the Society an annual practising fee of \$40.

“(2) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar—

“(a) That he has attained the age of 65 years (but has not attained the age of 70 years); or

“(b) That he is not resident in New Zealand; or

“(c) That he is no longer substantially engaged in pharmaceutical practice—

shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$20.

“(3) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar that he has attained the age of 70 years shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$5.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are made under the Pharmacy Act 1970, and amend the Pharmacy Regulations 1975.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement.

Regulation 2 substitutes a new provision for regulation 26 of the principal regulations relating to annual practising fees. The effects are:

- (a) To raise the ordinary practising fee from \$30 to \$40;
- (b) To raise the concessionary fee for pharmacists who have attained the age of 65 years from \$15 to \$20;
- (c) To introduce a new concessionary fee of \$5 for pharmacists who have attained the age of 70 years.
