



**THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1975, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 1st day of December 1980

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 57 (j) of the Pharmacy Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

---

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1975\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1981.

**2. Annual practising fee**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 26 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following regulation:

“26. (1) Subject to subclauses (2) to (4) of this regulation, every pharmacist shall pay to the Society an annual practising fee of \$50.

“(2) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar that he is not resident in New Zealand shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$30.

“(3) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar—

“(a) That he has attained the age of 65 years (but has not attained the age of 70 years); or

“(b) That he is no longer substantially engaged in pharmaceutical practice—

shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$25.

“(4) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar that he has attained the age of 70 years shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$5.”

**3. New Schedule of fees substituted**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

**4. Revocation**—The Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1\* are hereby consequentially revoked.

1. On application for registration (including certificate of registration if granted under section 13 of the Act) .....	20.00
2. For reinstatement of name in register after being removed for any reason other than at the request of the pharmacist	20.00
3. For reinstatement of name in register after being removed at the request of the pharmacist .....	10.00
4. For inspection of any register, roll, or document kept by the Society and open for inspection .....	1.00
Provided that no fee shall be payable by an officer of the Government seeking inspection in the course of his duties.	
5. For a duplicate of any certificate issued by the Council .....	10.00.”

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations are made under the Pharmacy Act 1970, and amend the Pharmacy Regulations 1975.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement.

Regulation 2 increases the ordinary and concessionary fees payable for practising certificates, except the concessionary fee for pharmacists who have attained the age of 70 years. That remains at \$5.

Regulation 3 increases certain administration fees relating to the registration of pharmacists.
