ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 57 (j) of the Pharmacy Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January
- 2. Annual practising fee—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 26 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the following regulation:

- "26. (1) Subject to subclauses (2) to (4) of this regulation, every pharmacist shall pay to the Society an annual practising fee of \$140.
- "(2) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar that he or she is not resident in New Zealand shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$80.
 - "(3) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar—
 - "(a) That he or she has attained the age of 65 years (but has not attained the age of 70 years); or
 - "(b) That he or she is no longer substantially engaged in pharmaceutical practice—

shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$70.

- "(4) A pharmacist who satisfies the Registrar that he or she has attained the age of 70 years shall be required to pay an annual practising fee of only \$10."
- **3. Fees exclusive of goods and services tax**—The fees prescribed by the principal regulations are exclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.
- **4. Revocation**—Regulation 2 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 3 is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1988, amend the Pharmacy Regulations 1975.

 $\overline{\textit{Regulation 2}}$ increases the ordinary and concessionary fees payable by pharmacists for practising certificates.

Regulation 3 makes it clear that the fees prescribed by the principal regulations are exclusive of goods and services tax.
