



**THE PHYSIOTHERAPY REGULATIONS 1979,
AMENDMENT NO. 4**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 29th day of May 1989

THE RIGHT HON. G. W. R. PALMER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 31 (2) (e) of the Physiotherapy Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Physiotherapy Regulations 1979, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Physiotherapy Regulations 1979* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1989.

2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 17 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Physiotherapy Regulations 1979, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the following regulation:

“17. (1) The fee for admission to the State Examination for any student physiotherapist sitting the full examination shall be \$56.25.

“(2) The fee for admission to the State Examination for any student physiotherapist whom the Board has directed need not sit the full examination shall be \$33.75.

“(3) The fee payable on an application for registration shall be \$67.50.

“(4) The fee for the issue of a certificate of registration shall be \$22.50.

“(5) The fee for the issue of an annual practising certificate shall be \$78.75.

“(6) The fee for the restoration of a name to the register, pursuant to an application under section 16 (4) of the Act, shall be \$39.38.

“(7) The fee for amending the register to add further qualifications, pursuant to an application under section 14 (1) of the Act, shall be \$11.25.

“(8) The fee for a certificate of temporary registration shall be \$67.50.

“(9) The fee for the correction of a name in the register, pursuant to an application under section 18 (2) of the Act (not being a case to which the proviso to that subsection applies), shall be \$11.25.”

3. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The fees fixed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

4. Revocation—The Physiotherapy Regulations 1979, Amendment No. 3 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1989, prescribe a new and increased scale of fees payable under the Physiotherapy Act 1949 to reflect the increase in goods and services tax.
