



THE PASSPORT REGULATIONS 1981, AMENDMENT NO. 4

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 19th day of June 1989

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 18 of the Passports Act 1980, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Passport Regulations 1981* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 15th day of July 1989.

2. Fees—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by repealing regulation 2, and substituting the following regulation:

“2. (1) In respect of any matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, where the application is lodged—

“(a) In New Zealand; or

“(b) In Rarotonga by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in the Cook Islands; or

“(c) In Niue by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in Niue; or

“(d) In Apia by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in Tokelau,—

a fee shall be payable in accordance with column A in that Schedule.

“(2) In respect of any matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, in any case to which subclause (1) of this regulation does not apply a fee shall be payable in accordance with column B in that Schedule.”

3. New scale of fees substituted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

4. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The fees fixed by regulation 2 of these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax payable under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

5. Revocation—The Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 3 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 15 July 1989, prescribe a new and increased scale of fees payable under the Passports Act 1980 to reflect the increase in goods and services tax. They also provide that New Zealand citizens who are ordinarily resident in the Cook Islands, Niue, or Tokelau and who apply in Rarotonga, Niue, or Apia pay the same fees as applicants in New Zealand. Applicants in other places pay higher fees.
