



THE PASSPORT REGULATIONS 1981, AMENDMENT NO. 5

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 21st day of January 1992

Present:

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 18 of the Passports Act 1980, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Passport Regulations 1981* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 2 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 4), and substituting the following regulation:

“2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“‘The Act’ means the Passports Act 1980:

“‘Certificate of identity’ means a certificate of identity issued in accordance with regulation 7 (1) of these regulations:

“‘Department’ means the Department of Internal Affairs:

“‘Passport’ means a New Zealand passport:

“‘Secretary’ means the Secretary for Internal Affairs.”

3. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 8, and substituting the following regulation:

“8. (1) Fees in accordance with the Schedule to these regulations shall be payable in respect of the several matters specified in the Schedule.

“(2) In respect of any matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, where the application is lodged—

“(a) In New Zealand; or

“(b) In Rarotonga by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in the Cook Islands; or

“(c) In Niue by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in Niue; or

“(d) In Apia by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in Tokelau,—

a fee shall be payable in accordance with column A in that Schedule.

“(3) In respect of any matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, in any case to which subclause (2) of this regulation does not apply a fee shall be payable in accordance with column B in that Schedule.”

4. New scale of fees substituted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 4), and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

5. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The fees set out in column A of the Schedule to these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax payable under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

6. Revocation—The Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 4 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations have 2 principal effects.

First, a new fee is introduced for the issue of a passport to a child under 16 years. The fee is \$25.30 where the application is lodged in New Zealand or in certain other specified cases. The fee is \$49.50 in the remainder of cases. The current fees for the issue of a passport are \$56.25 and \$110 respectively. Those fees are unchanged for the issue of a passport to an adult. No other changes are made to the current fees.

Secondly, the regulations reinstate the interpretation provision that was contained in regulation 2 of the principal regulations. That provision was revoked in error by the Passport Regulations 1981, Amendment No. 4.
